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WHY NOT EMPOWERFULL!

An interview with **Anxhela bruci** by voice it

Anxhela Bruci is the Founder of EmpowerFULL. She has a clear goal to create a network of entrepreneurs who are survivors.

Tell us about yourself and your work

I created "EmpowerFULL" (Fuqiplotë) to shape a new path for the economic empowerment of survivors who have experienced human trafficking. "EmpowerFULL" is an economic empowerment model that aims to create a sustainable employment path through selfemployment alternatives. The process of "EmpowerFULL" is divided into two phases. The purpose of the first phase is to build strong relationships between survivors and strengthen their entrepreneurial and employment skills through a sixmonth program. The training program is suitable for participants with low levels of education and incorporates nonformal educational methods. The second phase supports survivors to set up social enterprises and provide employment opportunities for the rest of the survivors who were part of the training program.

What inspired you?

Freedom! The more we lack freedom the more we appreciate its importance in our lives. Back in the 90s, when the Albanian rebellion happened in Albania, my family and I were smuggled across the border, by experiencing the fear that the next step ahead would be the last one alive, I learned from an early age the feeling of lacking safety and inclusion.

What was most surprising to you about your life?

The different paths I got in, from various geographical relocations to language hardships and community stigma, to a path of empowerment andtt embracement of challenges. Above all, I was surprised by the power that I found within me when anything else seemed to be failing.

Is there an achievement or contribution that you are most proud of?

Working on the "EmpowerFULL" model has been among the initiatives that I am most proud of, it has given meaning to the work that

I do, and added a purpose to my existence. Waking up in the morning and realising that I have been gifted with the chance of being alive for another day, is extraordinary, what makes it even more unique, is contributing to a more equitable world.

What was the biggest challenge you have faced?

Getting out of my comfort zone, I have struggled to challenge my fears and see beneath them.

What did you do to try to solve the challenges?

I find myself going through a three-step process, which involves pausing, reflecting, and taking action: a) Pausing, being aware of how my brave heart in the size of a fist keeps bravely surviving, acknowledging the beauty of nature and what happens around it, embracing the calmness of sunset and being present; b) Reflecting, on past experiences, behaviours, on the people that I have met, the knowledge that I have acquired from them. There is always something to take and leave from the past; c) Acting, one...two...three...go!

What would you say to every young woman out there?

Take a moment to pause and reflect on the experiences that you have had so far, and ask yourself "are these the result of my dreams?" We might find ourselves running in endless fields with no direction, being travellers of other people's lives, living in their story while the pages of our story are left blank. Through reflection, we could find answers to questions that we have never thought about. To me, what is most important, is knowing that I can take ownership of my decisions with honour and maturity.

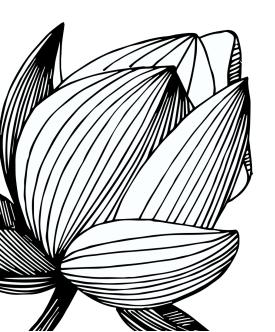


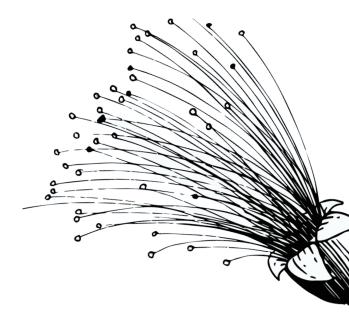

The love and compassion that you cultivate will be the fuel to a lasting legacy, as if your actions are based in love, there is nothing that you cannot achieve or transform for the betterment of our world.







Tell us about yourself and your work

I am a member of Creation Global, an international Chicago Footwork crew with over 70 members worldwide. Our crew is dedicated to the performance and preservation of Chicago-based African-American art forms, the development of the next generation of leaders and artists, and building global connections to strengthen our multicultural movement.

I also co-produces an event called Chicago Footworkology, which is an online footwork camp that provides dance and music education programming to hundreds of artists worldwide each year. I envision and work towards an international network of artists, who will be able to creatively and collectively develop a more healthy earth.

Through our process of working through and eliminating sexist and oppressive cultural norms, women will come to understand two very powerful tools: compassion and love. Because as a woman, I am not looking to dominate spaces, I am seeking balance.

What inspired you?

Inspiration as an artist is everything. When we feel genuinely inspired to express something about this human experience, we connect with our unique purpose as an artist.

I have been inspired by anything from a small bird flying by, to seeing my crewmate battle against a rival dance crew, to feeling the sting of pain when leaving a living space I have occupied for weeks while traveling across India. These moments of pleasure and pain, ups and downs, inspire me daily to create and express. As an artist, I work hard to be transparent about life so that I may inspire others to be radically honest in their creative processes.

I work hard to dismantle societal norms and false narratives formed throughout different stages of my life, so that I may express myself in a space of raw honesty. When an artist expresses truth, they have the power to break down boundaries of language, culture, location, and time to inspire others. What inspires me most as an artist is connecting with others on a deeper level, inciting the transformation of the spirit.

What was the biggest challenge you have faced?

As we discussed in the interview, moving to India and leaving my community in the USA was very difficult. For the first 8 months, we were in a small village and I did not really connect with any friends at that time. I felt alone and that I had less freedom to express myself as a woman than I did in California

There were difficult nights in the hospital from food poisoning or other issues. I was assaulted. I was touched inappropriately at the airport by a man. We witnessed a lot of death, as Varanasi is the city where many people in India go to die to then be burned on the Ganges river. It was a culture shock coupled with hurtful experiences. However, I feel grateful every day for those times because I feel that they allowed me to practice resilience.

If things were always easy, where would my practice of resilience come from? If I never felt danger, how would I recognize true safety? Because it was a challenge to experience those things, it was a blessing along my path.

What did you do to try to solve the challenges?

I connected with the dance community in India. They brought a wave of relief and

joy! Community is everything because you are always stronger together. I learned how to better function as a woman in India. I learned how to cross the streets of Delhi, where to eat healthy food in Bangalore, how to get a cab to travel safely in Haryana, how to rely on a group while taking a bus to Jaipur, and how to ask for food or a place to stay when so many things were changing or falling apart with friends or work.

The adventure was pleasurable because I reached out to the community. There is no way I could have survived or thrived alone.

What does being a woman mean to you.

To me, being a woman is a divine unfolding process. I investigate what it is to be in this form and energy on a daily basis. Being a woman holds a great deal of power. For example our ability to create life and nourish life both physically and metaphorically. It is too often in many cultures around the world that women are considered weaker, and there are even laws prohibiting women's equal rights to exist in the same way that men do.

KARIN KRENNER

I manifest a complex personality in my relationship with the world. A combination of hard-core practical, intuition and open heartedness. When I started my career after University, the primary directive for a journalist was to be a "neutral observer". Write and photograph the facts and events then move on. This neutrality was important. It is what embodied the protection of the "presspass". We were neutral and followed the facts of

the story. Over several years and various international conflicts, I started to feel less able to simply observe and more inclined to get involved. Especially when there were women and children in crisis. This eventually led me to cross over into the field of human rights and legal justice. My work is deeply integrated with my passion for humanity and a belief in "untethering justice".

I define this in an understanding that a law may no longer be legitimate in a changing society and world. Law, like language, needs to be a fluid environment that is tested by current events. My personal and foundational heart directive is that every individual should have the right and freedoms to "choose" their own path in life. Working in the legal justice arena allows me a platform to create impactful change that resonates in social justice and individual choice.

What is your inspiration?

My inspiration evolved from wanting a different future for my children. Being a single mother is challenging on both the practical and emotional fronts. Embracing deep, life-long relationships in the diverse communities I have lived and worked in gave me a global family of love and encouragement. In my own search for justice, similar stories of mothers and children resonated across borders and cultures. It seemed like a "calling". Eventually, that clarified into for me, a purpose for my work. Finding "common ground" in conflicting legal systems across borders.

As a woman directly challenging sometimes archaic social and legal systems, I found my voice needed to be stronger and deeply transparent. At that time, the social patriarchal power dynamics were almost impossible to challenge and as a single mother, resources were either non-existent or extremely limited. There were many times when I was very frightened by the power inequity and how it played out. This pushed me toward unprecedented actions and creative solutions. I feel that as women (and mothers) we have an innate capability and strength for survival and protection that becomes at times, our "super-power". That super-power has and will continue to impact

with positive changes for justice not only for women but for society as a whole.

What is the most surprising thing about your life?

Oh, I have a few more than one. Hard to pick, lol. That I am still alive! There have been some close calls over the years. That my boys grew into such genuine, heartful young men. Gratitude at how many wonderful and "angel-souled" people have come into my life from my work and travels. It never ceases to amaze me how the right people enter your life at the perfect moment.

Is there any particular moment or memory that stands out for you?

Again, so many! Life is an adventure. A) The birth of my two sons. B) The pivotal moment when after 12 years of challenging family courts in 4 countries, a judgement was handed down in my legal case that set precedent law to change international protection laws in domestic violence.

What is your Biggest Challenge?

The biggest challenge was continuing to believe, against all voices to the contrary, that I was right to keep fighting. So many well-intentioned people telling me "give up, it's impossible". That was hard and made me feel very alone at times. My greatest emotional allies in hard times are music and nature. I find that they both free my mind and heart to created space for new thoughts and hope. Simple as this may sound, they have taken me from despair to renewed energy. And coffee. Always, Coffee! But, how do I solve challenges? Intuition (which is another form of belief) and research. Can't ever do enough research. For me, it is the map to finding solutions.

"Healthy living" to most people means both physical and mental health are in balance or functioning well together in a person. In many instances, physical and mental health are closely linked, so that a change (good or bad) in one directly affects the other. Consequently, some of the tips will include suggestions for emotional and mental "healthy living."

All humans have to eat food for the growth and maintenance of a healthy body and mind, but we humans have different nutrition requirements at different stages of our lives. For example, infants may require feeding every 2 hours until they gradually age and begin to take in more solid foods. Eventually, they develop into the more normal pattern of eating fives times per day as young kids

Here are some heathy tips for you to help you eat right as an adult and maintain your mental health status:

Food Etiquette



Eat 3 healthy meals

Eat three healthy meals a day (breakfast, lunch, and dinner); it is important to remember that dinner should not have to be the largest meal.



A BALANCED DIET

Imagine your meal for a day is a pie-chart. What you require is 20% of the pie chart as carbohydrates, 30% protein, 10% fat and 40% vegetables.



CONTENT MATTERS

The bulk of food consumption should consist of healthy foods, such as fruits, vegetables, whole grains (rice, cereal), fat-free or low-fat milk products. Incorporate lean meats, poultry, fish, beans, eggs, and nuts (with emphasis on beans and nuts) into a healthy diet.



intuitive Eating

This is when you eat only when you are hungry and stop once you get full. Control portion sizes; eat the smallest portion that can satisfy hunger and then stop eating.



Healthy Snacks

Healthy snacks are OK in moderation and should consist of items like fruit, whole grains, or nuts (almond nuts and cashew nuts to satisfy hunger and not cause excessive weight gain.



Mental Health

Healthy living involves more than physical health, it also includes emotional or mental health. The following are some ways people can support their mental health and well-being.



A walk

Take a walk and reflect on what you see and hear at least several times per week.



Get enough sleep

Get enough sleep daily. It is very important that you find time to sleep. Sleep gives you time to reboost your energy and brain.



Leisure Time

Try to make some leisure time to do somethings that interest you every week(hobby, sport). Learn ways to say "no" when something occurs that you do not want to do or be involved with. Have fun (go on a trip with someone you love, go shopping, go fishing; do not let vacation time slip away). Try something new and often(eat new food, try a different route to work, go to a new museum display). Do some mind exercises (read, do a puzzle occasionally during the week).

Social Entrepreneur by Heart

My name is Nargiz Askarova. I am originally from Baku, Azerbaijan. Currently, I am living in Estonia. I consider myself a social entrepreneur by heart, and I am the founder of NewHorizons Adolescent Girl Empowerment Program.

NewHorizons is an impact oriented social enterprise that inspires, educates, and empowers young girls aged between 11 to 16 years old from developing countries. We do this through selfesteem, confidence, leadership, and entrepreneurship activities. Our mission is to help the adolescent girls to become strong and independent individuals and to make the world a better place. At the moment the program is running online in Azerbaijan and we have more than 20 active program participants from different regions of country.

Your Inspiration?

I grew up in a conservative society where a woman's voice is not heard often. Since my school-age time I used to see how the customs and traditions, people's mindset, general environment in the community used to cripple the young girl's future.

Many of my classmates dropped out of school to be married. When we were in the grade 9th and after I hear that they regret to be married off so early and never did anything for their dreams or try to fulfill their true potential. Hearing all of these sad stories, seeing the hope in the young girls' eyes about their bright future inspired me to take this initiative and build the NewHorizons. I want to see the future female generation stronger and independent.

What does being a woman mean to you?

For me being a woman means being strong, independent, having choices, having her own opinion and dreams. Being woman is a beautiful feeling.

What was most surprising to you about your life?

The most surprising thing was when I first found my true-life mission. I could say it was a big turning point time for me. After deciding that I will work for the rest of my life to empower the girls, my vision of self expanded. It made me leave the village of Baku and go from there to Canada, Kenya, and now Estonia. I think your life truly changes and you start to feel at peace when you find your true mission in life.

What Achievements are you most Proud of?

Yes. I should say I have two achievements which I am most proud of. One of them is organising a free summer school for the young schoolgirls in my community and another one is to get accepted at the Youth Leadership program DOT (Digital Opportunity Trust) in Canada which boosted my social entrepreneurial journey.

What is the Biggest Challenge you have ever Faced?

Every day almost there are small or big challenges we need to solve. The biggest challenge I have ever faced was building completely a new life from scratch in a new country. One and a half year ago I consciously made this decision in order to force myself to come out from my comfort zone and to use my full potential as much as I can. Because I personally believe that real self-development starts once, we are outside of our comfort zone.



How I Solved my challenges

I only know one thing: it does not matter what happens, take a rest and move on. I think we can overcome all the challenges we face by the right mindset we develop in us. Having the right attitudes and approaches can help us to come out from any difficult situations.

Being in a new country all alone was sometimes difficult, and whenever I felt tired, first of all I took a rest and then I reminded myself why I did this. Reminding yourself of your dreams really helps a lot in challenging times.

Is there any particular moment or memory that stands out for you?

Life is a gift to us. We need to enjoy each moment and to create as much as positive memories we can. I have had many great memories in my life but if I have to choose the best one, that would be the day when I started to receive feedback from the parents of the girls, how they were happy about the positive changes the program made in their daughters lives. When they said now my daughter is not shy to express her opinions or she got so clear about her future, these words gave me internal power to move ahead and create more opportunities for them.

What would you say to every young woman out there?

Never be afraid to dream big and everyday do your best for you dreams. Invest a lot on yourself. Life will pay back later.

Who are you and What do you do?

I am an adherent soul winner, a social entrepreneur, activists, a humanitarian and a social worker. I am currently the Public Relations Officer for Girls in Charge Foundation based in Nigeria. I also manage another Foundation, I work as the state coordinator for Pieces of Peace Women, Lagos, Nigeria chapter. I also in

the department of operations at Christ Embassy.

What I do is to give voice and be the voice for vulnerable people in society especially the slum community.

What inspired you?

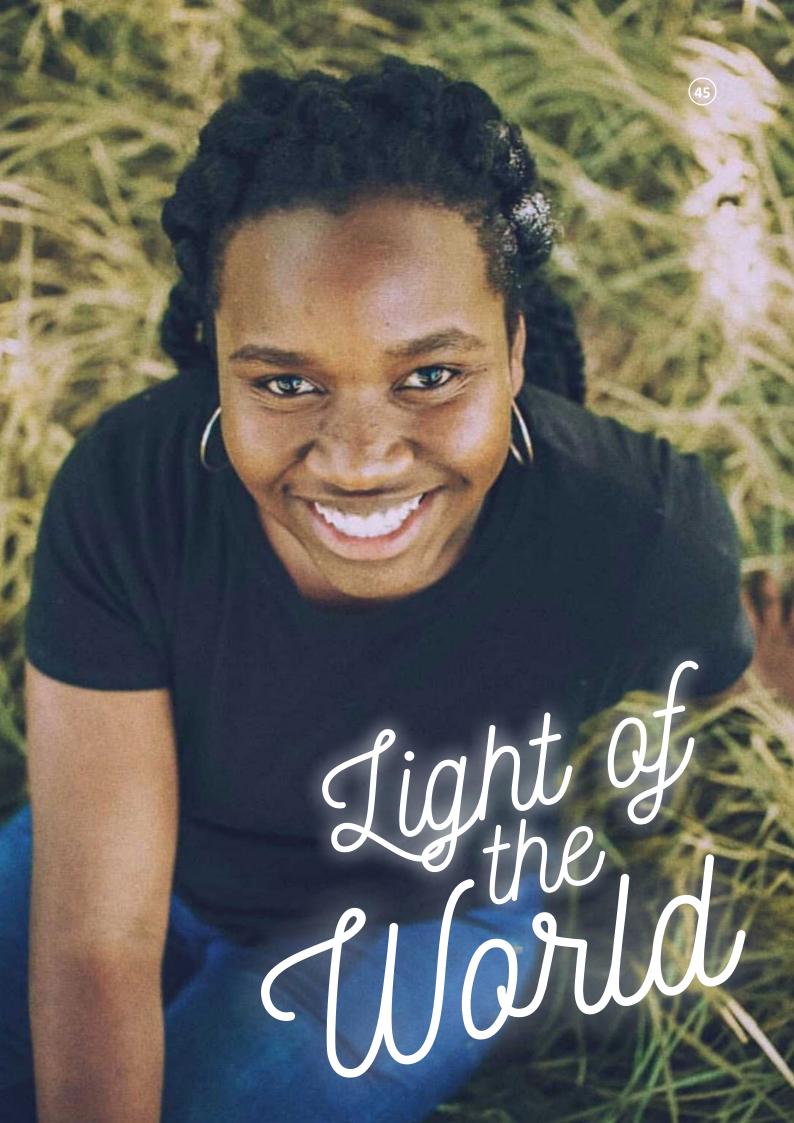

Professionally, I am a lawyer, I started practicing after I joined the bar and I was actively practicing law for a few years till my children were born. I have two children, a son and a daughter. I have been married for 25 years now.

Once my children were born I took a break for a couple of years and then, ventured into the social sector, something which has always interested me even at my younger age.

Initially, I was working with NGOs and at the organization where I became a Vice-President, I have gotten involved in social service. I became a vice-president in an organization, where women were empowered and educated to come out of poverty.

Slowly, I started noticing that empowering women, empowering the girl child which has been very close to my heart was a direction I wanted to go into, and I did. I started working with rural women and empowering them. We started implementing skill development programs for these women. We wanted to give them some purpose in life, and we have had some amazing success stories.

During the lockdown, I decided to start an online show interviewing women. At first, I wanted to only interview women in my reach but my husband advised me to reach out to women around the world. "Do not think local, think Global".

Reaching to women across the globe has been so inspiring, hearing their stories and their voices has broadened my horizon on how I view things now.

I now work with Ecstatic foundation and who motivated me, was because of my father who was a respected physicist in the community and very well know, and my mum who was a very strong woman. I was given the opportunity to be educated despite the society views at that time in India. My parents supported me and showed me the value of education and because of this, I want to empower more girls and women in India, advocating for their rights to education and life.

My husband has been my greatest supporter and also my biggest critic, and because of that it has helped me overcome all challenges that I have faced. 50

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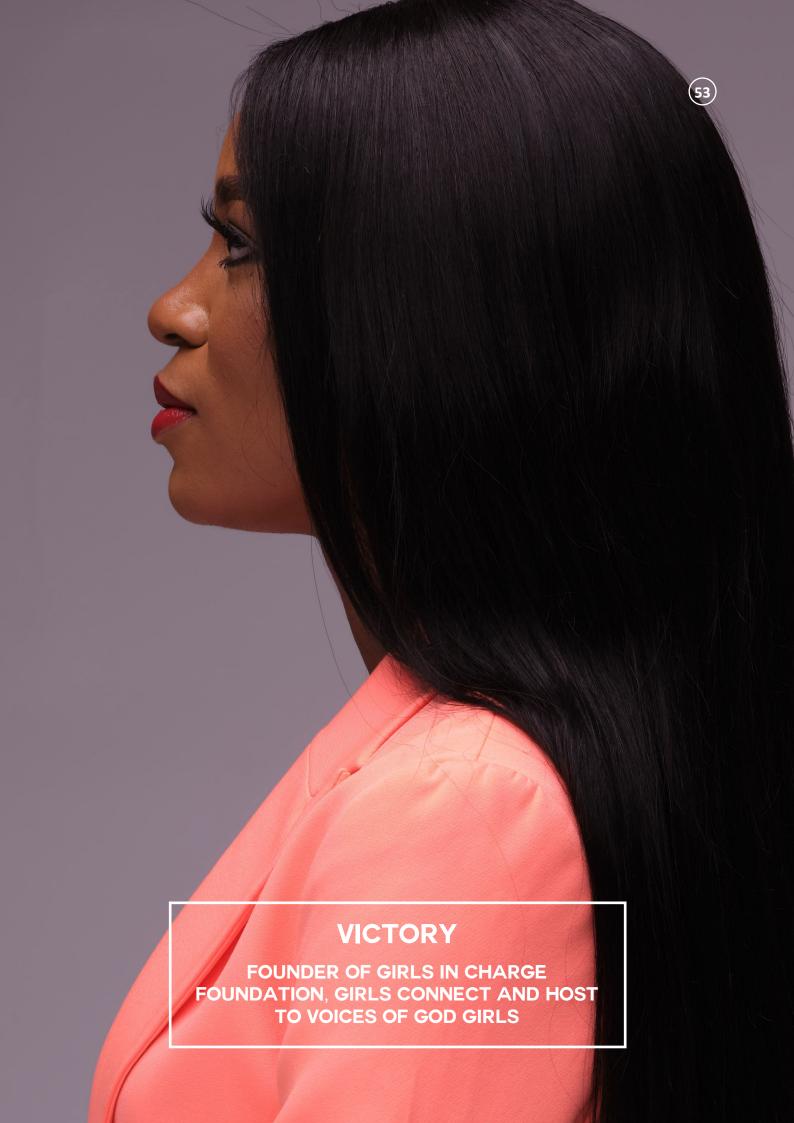


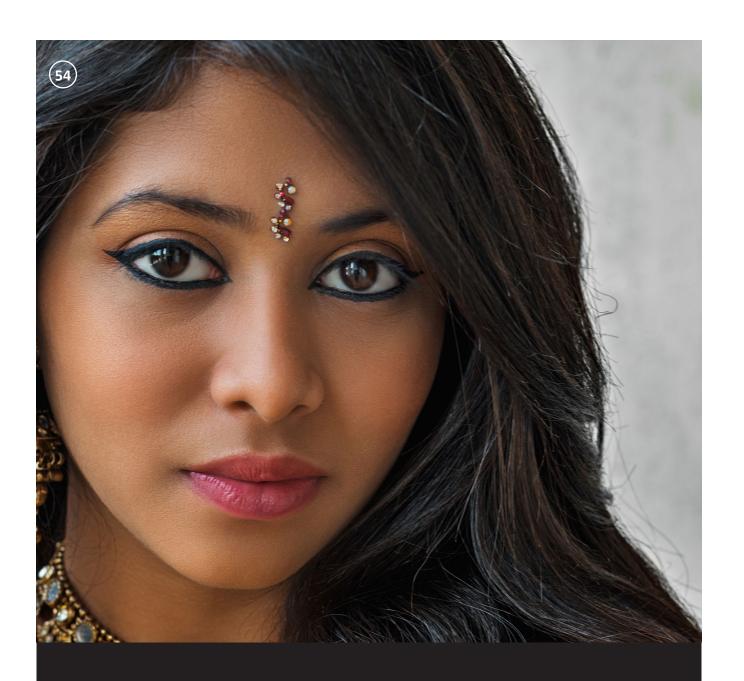
